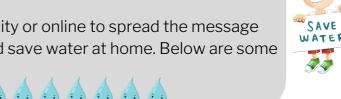
How to spread the word

The water in our taps comes from the river and aquifers (underground water storage that feeds our rivers).



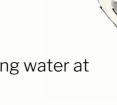
The average person in England uses 141 litres of water per day, our aim is to reduce that to 100 litres of water per day.
